The latest government guidelines means we need to change our plans for reopening. These frequent changes are as frustrating for us as I am sure they are for you but we are doing our best to respond as quickly as we can. More information will follow regarding next weeks' schedule.

In line with the latest government guidance, please find below **the plan for week commencing 4th January:**

1) WHAT DOES NOT CHANGE - AS MENTIONED ON THE 18th OF DECEMBER:

- **PS/MS pupils (Early Years)** will be welcomed back at CFBL
- **CE2 to 3ème pupils:** remote learning
- **children of critical workers and vulnerable children from CE2 to 3èmes (*)** will be welcomed back at CFBL

2) WHAT CHANGES:

In line with the announcement of the 1st January, we are **not authorised to welcome back** GSM, CP and CE1 pupils.

- **GSM, CP and CE1 pupils:** remote learning **from Monday 4th January** Sent also today by Mr Gassian to parents of GSM, CP and CE1 information for the school reopening management.

1) Ce qui ne change pas (conformément au message du 18 décembre 2020) :

- enfants de **keyworkers** et enfants dits "vulnerable" (*) du CE2 à la classe de 3^{ème} : accueil au CFBL dès **lundi 4 janvier au matin**.

2) Ce qui change :

*** CRITICAL WORKERS and VULNERABLE CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE**

Critical workers:

Parents whose work is critical to the coronavirus (COVID-19) include those who work in health and social care and in other key sectors: Health and social care, Education and childcare, Key public services, Local and national government, Food and other necessary goods, Public safety and national security, Transport and border ;

Vulnerable children and young people include those who:

- are assessed as being in need under section 17 of the Children Act 1989, including children and young people who have a child in need plan, a child protection plan or who are a looked-after child
- have an education, health and care (EHC) plan
- have been identified as otherwise vulnerable by educational providers or local authorities (including children's social care services), and who could therefore benefit from continued full-time attendance, this might include:
- children and young people on the edge of receiving support from children's social care services or in the process of being referred to children's services
- adopted children or children on a special guardianship order
- those at risk of becoming NEET ('not in employment, education or training')

- those living in temporary accommodation
- those who are young carers
- those who may have difficulty engaging with remote education at home (for example due to a lack of devices or quiet space to study)
- care leavers
- others at the provider and local authority's discretion including pupils and students who need to attend to receive support or manage risks to their mental health
